Each week I will record our lesson and make it available to you if you need to revisit the concepts throughout the week when working on your site.

Homework: Each week we will work on learning a new aspect of WordPress and Web Design in class but undoubtedly each student will have work that needs to be finished or practiced at home each week.

Supplies:

- Access to email
- Access to Cloud Storage (Google Drive is preferred)
- A laptop computer that you can bring to class each week. They will need to download the software for working with WordPress locally on their computers without the internet. They will also need storage space to store files, graphics, pics, etc to use in building their websites. This means that the computer should have a decent amount of hard drive space.
- Access to word processing software on their computer for writing content and storing information. If you don't have Microsoft Word there is a free version called Office Libre that I use and it is just as good as Word.
