Description: America the Beautiful: American History and Literature is a 15-week class that will meet over the course of two-semesters (30 weeks total). This course for middle school students combines American history and literature using the America the Beautiful curriculum, published by Notgrass History, and historical fiction novels to enhance the students' study of history. The multi-volume history text will move chronologically through American history highlighting key events, people, and places. Class time will also be used to discuss and analyze the assigned historical novels that compliment the study of history.

Homework: Homework assignments will include reading from the textbook, answering lesson review questions, reading from a literature selection, and occasional writing or enrichment assignments. Students should expect to spend a minimum of 4 hours per week on homework. Parents should be prepared to help their student in a variety of ways such as reading a syllabus, navigating Google Classroom, and keeping up with weekly assignments.

Description: This is a one hour LAB class supporting the Apologia Exploring Creation with Biology 2nd edition.

This course is designed to be the student's first high school science course and to provide a detailed introduction to the methods and concepts of general biology. With heavy emphasis on the vocabulary of biology, it provides the student with a strong background in the scientific method, the five-kingdom classification scheme, microscopy, biochemistry, cellular biology, molecular and Mendelian genetics, theory of evolution (based on the creationist world view), dissection, and ecosystems.

This is NOT A LECTURE CLASS. In depth lectures for each chapter will NOT be conducted in class. Class will be devoted to completing the labs each week. If a student needs help in understanding the material, parents will need to assist their student during the week. I am also available to answer questions as needed.

Study Guides and tests for each chapter are turned into the teacher for accountability, and are noted on the syllabus with due dates. Students are expected to come to class prepared for the lab by having read and done the book work BEFORE class.

This is a 15-week/2 semester course. We will perform all dissection labs in the 2nd semester.

Homework: -Students must be able to maintain required reading from the syllabus and be prepared for each experiment to be completed in class - approximately 3-4 hours per week.

-Formal lab reports are required for each experiment. Lab reports need to be complete and drawings need to be as accurate a picture as possible and that includes COLORED drawings. Colored pencils, crayons, markers, etc are REQUIRED.

-Study guides, OYO questions, and chapter tests will be turned into the teacher for each chapter. At the end of the school year students will have earned a full Biology grade, not just the lab portion.

Supplies: - "Exploring Creation with Biology" by Dr. Jay Wile (2nd Edition) - **please note this edition is no longer in print by Apologia** I have multiple copies that students may check out and borrow for the school year.

This is a true general science course covering a wide range of the branches of science. We will learn key study techniques as we cover topics including astronomy, meteorology, oceanography, earth study, geology, paleontology, and environmental science. This is a 2-semester, 15-week course.

Homework: Approximately 3-4 hours per week. Students will be expected to read modules for comprehension and study each module to be prepared for study guide questions, class experiments, and module exams.

-All tests will be completed online through Google Classroom.
Tests will be administered at home under parental supervision.

-All Formal lab reports will be typed on a Google Doc that will be provided on Google Classroom.

Integrated with health and nutrition information, as well as plenty of scripture and biblical application, this complete guide to the human body is written in an enjoyable, conversational tone that will keep kids engaged. Description: In this first year of ASL, students will learn the basics of sign articulation, grammar and Deaf culture. Learning the manual alphabet, numbers and descriptive signs, students will be able to express sign language effectively and to receptively understand what is signed. Completion of this course can be used to fulfill one foreign language credit for high school. ASL 1 covers Units 1-3 in the Master ASL Level One book by Jason E. Zinza. The purchase of the book is not required and copies will be made and provided during the semester.

Students must meet these requirements to continue on to ASL 2:

*A passing grade of 80 or higher

*A passing assessment of proficiency based on the teacher's end of semester evaluation

*A positive, engaged attitude throughout the semester. (meaning full attention and respect given as stated in our PATH handbook and policies)

Homework: One expressive (signing) and one receptive (voicing) assignment will be assigned weekly. This means access to a computer and a recording device (cell phone) is required to submit work.

Check Google Classroom for Homework. Assignments and materials will be posted by 12 noon on Tuesdays following our Mondays class, so I can custom each assignment based on what was covered.

DAILY Google Classroom login is required to watch Master ASL curriculum vocabulary videos. These videos will continue to teach and review language and Deaf culture taught in Monday's class. Please watch and practice vocabulary and materials daily for a least 15-20 minutes or more for language exposure and practice!

Two SILENT NIGHT OUTS are required for hands up practice and participation grades.

Through classroom discussion boards, students will engage in online discourse that will challenge their critical thinking on current topics and human nature. For the writing portion, students will write two rhetorical précis, an eight-page research analysis, and a literary analysis essay. This class is designed to prepare high school students for the critical thinking and written discourse that is typical of college level courses and post-high school experiences. At the completion of the course, students will have earned one high school English language art credit.

*Note: Students need a strong grasp of two-step algebraic type math to get the most out of this class. Completed pre-algebra course strongly recommended.

Homework: Students must purchase, both the textbook (Apologia Exploring Creation with Physical Science, 3rd edition), and the student notebook. It is highly recommended that parents also purchase the test solutions booklet, as it contains the solutions to the study guides.

Students will be responsible to complete a reading assignment and student notebook pages each week. In addition, they will preview any labs that we will be conducting in class.
